Dear Parish Family,

Soup Kitchen



Three times a week the Soup Kitchen continues to provide hot, healthy and nutritious meals to anyone in need, There are no criteria and no one is turned away. Our method of

distribution has changed to take out meals only. Serving days are still Tuesday and Thursdays from 4:00 pm to 5:30 pm and Saturdays from 9:30 am to 11:00 am.

The new procedure takes a bit longer but our guests are still very grateful that we are open and able to provide them with food. Extra items such as bakery, breads, produce are still available.

Thank you to the volunteers who give endless hours of their time and energy for this ministry. The Soup Kitchen currently averages 800-1200 meals per month. Our annual Bake Sale and Ministry Fair may or may not happen in February 2021 due to current conditions. Please feel free to donate to the Soup Kitchen if you are able.

GRIEF MINISTRY

Grief is a normal and natural response to loss. Many times grief is misunderstood because of cultural biases that are based in misinformation and myths surrounding grief. Time heals all wounds is one such myth, as well as time limits placed on grief, or attempts at replacing the loss. Fr. Michael brings his many years of experience to Our Lady of the Lake within end of life ministry as well as pastoral support to the bereaved to assist those struggling through grief to overcome and move through their unique grief journey. Fr. Michael holds various Master's level degrees in theology, and mental health and wellness with an emphasis in grief. Grief Recovery Method is a seven to eight session series that assists grieves with graphing their life loss history and various relationships as they pertain to loss. Fr. Michael is a certified grief recovery specialist with Grief Recovery and offers the series in intervals. Grief Collage is yet another experience in grief management that creatively seeks to foster posture grief through small group discussion, dialogue, and the art of creative collage incorporating the elements of grief into the creation a very unique masterpiece, your grief in pictures and tribute to a deceased loved one. These opportunities of ministry at the parish are meant to move participants from hurting to healing.

YOUTH MINISTRY

Youth Ministry's mission is to lead teens and their families closer to Christ. We seek to empower young people to fully participate in the life and mission of the Church (to continue the work of Jesus Christ, and to make his name known and loved everywhere), so that they may grow holistically into mature Catholic adults who will practice their faith, and ultimately to become saints.

This year we have been using an in-person, virtual hybrid model for our meetings, where we explore the Catholic faith, and how it is to be lived by each individual. We have a leadership team of adults and teens that plan and put together our gatherings. We host annual retreats, and help other ministries and causes such as Pregnancy Care (through Baby Shower Month), and the Giving Tree through St. Vincent De Paul.

Liturgical Ministries

<u>ALTAR GUILD</u> - Members of the Altar Guild are rotated on a weekly bases to wash and clean the linens used during the Mass.

<u>ALTAR SERVERS</u> - Boys and girls from 4th grade through high school are invited to join. Servers assist the priest at the altar and help the assembly pray. You must attend training meetings and rehearsals for special celebrations.

BREAK OPEN THE WORD LEADERS & ASSISTANTS - Leaders and Assistants break open (share) the Sunday readings for children Kindergarten through 6th grade during the 10:30 am Mass.

<u>EXTRAORDINARY MINISTERS OF HOLY COMMUNION (EM)</u> - Extraordinary Ministers assist the priest at Mass by helping distribute the Body and Blood of our Lord, Jesus Christ, to the faithful. This ministry is open to fully participating Catholics who have a reverence, respect and love for the Eucharist and strive to live out the call to be Eucharist (Christ) to those we meet and serve.

<u>SICK & HOMEBOUND MINISTERS</u> - These ministers take Holy Communion to those who are not able to come to Mass, whether they are at home, nursing home or hospital. Visits are usually made on a weekly basis.

MINISTERS OF THE WORD (LECTORS) - The lector proclaims the Word of God at Mass during the Liturgy of the Word. This ministry is open to fully participating Catholics who have a love for Sacred Scripture and desire to learn more about the Word of God as they proclaim his Word to the listening assembly.

<u>MUSIC MINISTRY</u> - The role of the cantor, choir, and musician is to lead the assembly in prayer through singing and music to enhance the prayer experience during the Liturgy. The cantors, choir, bell choir and musicians meet once a week. This ministry is open to musicians and all who love to sing praises to our Lord and lead the assembly in prayer and song. No experience is necessary to join.

<u>SACRISTAN</u> - A sacristan is a person who sets up everything for the Celebration of the Mass. The sacristan arrives early and begins to set up vestments for the priest and deacon, chalices, sacred vessels, makes sure the books are set among other things. It is the role of the sacristan to make sure everything is ready for the Mass.

MINISTERS OF HOSPITALITY (GREETERS & USHERS) - Ushers/Greeters welcome those who come to worship, tend to their needs, help them find a place to sit, if needed, gather their gifts during the collection, and bid them farewell when the Mass is over.

<u>VIDEO PROJECTION MINISTRY</u>— Our Video Projection Ministry helps with projection of song lyrics and video during our weekend Mass celebrations.

Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace You as if You were already there and unite myself wholly to You. Never permit me to be separated from You. Amen.

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GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

December 25, 2020 The Nativity of the Lord

If the salutation, "Merry Christmas," is more than just the expected greeting we use today, then what is the "more" really all about? Today is a sacred day and the birth of Christ has changed not only history but how human beings perceive and relate with God. God has become one with humanity in the Person of Jesus Christ. All of these truths remain just pious sentiments unless they take flesh in the heart and soul of each one of us. We need to absorb and immerse ourselves in what is meant by these truths so that we can be changed by them. Today is born our Savior, Christ the Lord!

A woman once recounted her journey with poverty and how she went from "doing" for the poor to "being with" the poor. It's transforming and life changing. It's easy to simply give alms to those in need, and yet another thing to be with them in their poverty and become poor ourselves. A change of the axis from vertical to horizon puts a whole new twist on things. Our souls understand the experience in ways that our minds simply cannot. Christmas requires this same change of axis.

It is one thing to sing out the words, "Joy to the World," and quite another to experience that joy ourselves. Many have not experienced the full impact of that first Holy Night because they choose to keep the manager at a distance rather than make a home with the Holy One who resides there. The birth of Christ levels the playing field of life and we have to allow ourselves to be leveled. There is no way to truly be human unless we understand that God is with us and blesses every—fiber of the human experience.
