

Pastor's Corner

The Transformative Value of Confession

Beloved Parishioners,

As we draw close to celebrating the great mystery of the history of our salvation, I share with you the amazing value of confession which helps us to experience the joy of the love of Jesus.

"I absolve you from your sins in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit..." These transformative words from the mouth of a priest after a penitent goes for confession are not only salvific but also therapeutic. St. Thomas Aguinas captured this idea well in the following words: "In the life of the body, a man is sometimes sick, and unless he takes medicine, he will die. Even so, in the spiritual life, a man is sick on account of sin. For that reason, he needs medicine so that he may be restored to health; this grace is bestowed in the sacrament of penance." It is therefore not surprising that those who visit the confessional, experience a sense of relief, of healing, of empowerment that an obstacle has been overcome, and a commitment to stay away from the sin that was confessed. This psycho-spiritual benefit is something every member of our Christian community needs, and its roots are enshrined in the Bible.

The biblical foundation of confession in the Old and New Testaments draws out the values of that sacrament for every one of us. The book of Proverbs 28:13 states, "No one who conceals transgressions will prosper, but one who confesses and forsakes them will obtain mercy." The Lord speaking to Moses in Numbers 5:5-7 also says, "When a man or a woman wrongs another, breaking faith with that person incurs guilt and shall confess the sin that has been committed." Other texts, like Daniel 9:4-19 and Hosea 6 and 14 describe exhortations for the acknowledgement of sins and reconciliation with God through collective confession. In the New Testament, the first letter of St. John asserts, "If we say that we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. If we confess our sins, he who is faithful and just will forgive us our sins and cleanse us from all unrighteousness. If we say that we have not sinned, we make him a liar, and his word is not in us." (I John 1:8-10). All of these were capped up in the authority given by Christ to His apostles, and, by extension, the Church regarding the power to forgive sins. In the gospel of Matthew, Peter is given authority by Christ, who says: "I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven, and whatever you bind on earth will be bound in

heaven, and whatever you loose on earth will be loosed in heaven." (Matthew 16:19). This mandate is reiterated in Mt 18:18 and Jn 20:23.

Penance is, thus, a sacrament of reunion and reconciliation with God. It is a "meeting point between the prodigal son, seeking forgiveness, and the love of the Father who is calling him." St. Paul had appealed to us, saying, "We beseech you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God" (2 Cor 5:20). If a Christian's conscience is burdened by serious sin, then the path of penance through the sacrament of reconciliation becomes necessary for reconciliation (Ecclesia de Eucharistia, 37). This reunion keeps us in a state of grace to participate in the sacrament of the Holy Eucharist. Paul had warned us in I Cor 11:28-29 that, "each one must examine himself before he eats of the bread and drinks of the cup. Anyone who eats and drinks without recognizing the body eats and drinks judgment on himself." Therefore, we all must ensure to be in a state of grace as communicants by visiting the confessional.

Not only does confession rebuild our broken relationship with God, but it also fosters reconciliation and healing in our relationships with others. Through this sacrament, we are encouraged to seek forgiveness from those we have wronged and to extend forgiveness to those who have hurt us, thereby promoting peace, reconciliation, and unity within the community. Some people still find it difficult to forgive hurts, past relationships, and bad words others say about them because we have not embraced confession. This Lenten season is a perfect time to allow Jesus to fix us. Allow Him to take away the baggage that weighs us down.

Furthermore, when we become acquainted with the sacrament of reconciliation, we become spiritually renewed and revitalized. This enables us, as Catholics, to experience a profound sense of liberation and freedom from the burdens of guilt and shame. By confessing our sins and receiving absolution, we are empowered to embark on a journey of inner transformation, embracing God's love and mercy, and striving for holiness in our lives.

Finally, we must remember that there is no sin too heavy for God to forgive. The sacrament of reconciliation, when approached with sincerity and humility, brings to us a soothing experience of the joy of God's forgiveness. When did you last have that experience? The Lord is inviting you to the confessional today.

Theme: Jesus Humbles Himself Out of Love He Has for Us

Palm Sunday Year B, March 24, 2024

1st Reading Isaiah 50:4-7, 2nd Reading Philippians 2:6-11, Gospel Mark 12:12-16

The passion narrative gives us an insight of what Jesus suffered for us, especially the love He has for us that made Him endure all the insults and humiliation for our sake. Today's liturgy does not require a long homily but to allow the events of the passion story to speak directly to us in the silence of our heart. Our meditation is on Jesus' suffering and death for our sake. He came and gave Himself completely to us by His preaching, miracles and healing and finally of giving Himself in humility on the cross.

Today, we recall how Jesus entered Jerusalem in humility to complete the work of our salvation to undergo suffering, denial and finally death for our sake and to rise after three days. Today begins the most sacred week called Holy Week in our Christian liturgy. One of the ways we can participate actively in this week's events and enjoy the beauty of the celebration is to maintain some level of interior silence and quietness. The Church invites us to open ourselves since we have all gathered with faith to commemorate that triumphal entry into Jerusalem. If we participate in this journey with our Lord, we are sure to rise with Him on Easter Sunday. Jesus entered into Jerusalem riding on an ass because to ride on a horse for the Jews would indicate a war king or war Lord but on ass signifies that the person is for peace and wants peace. That is why He reprimands Peter when Peter cuts off the ear of the high priest servant and tells him to shield his sword because He came for peace.

The main focus of triumph of Jesus is His to put things triumph over evil, death, sin, and suffering. Jesus as God has foreseen all His suffering and death He was about to undergo and how He will be ill-treated by those He has cared for, by those He fed when they were hungry, and those He healed their sickness and cured their infirmities. to put things mystery lead Blessed Son Celebration.

These are the same people who would insult Him and make all kinds of mockery of Him. One would have expected Him to withdraw back in the midst of all these evils but since He has come to defeat the power of evil over humanity He remained firm. He was obedient unto death that even when the passersby made a mockery of Him by telling Him if you are the son of God "save yourself by coming down from the cross." He remained on the cross, He chose to remain there because He knew, that is the only way to save the world. The devil does not like the cross and wants to take Him away from the cross. In our own lives too, we encounter situations whereby we wish to avoid the cross to choose the easy way out. Jesus' example on choosing to remain on the cross instead of coming down is a clear indication that we should not listen to voices that would want to distract us from carrying our own cross in life when the situation calls for

In the same way, anytime we are in the crisis of choosing between good and evil and we choose good then we have allowed God to triumph in that situation. When we are faced with the struggle between giving in to sin or not and we avoid the sin, then Jesus has triumphed in that very moment. Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem should also be an opportunity to reflect on how often we triumph over sin, negative forces and evil that come our way in our daily lives. It would be good if we use the Palm Sunday of this particular year to put things straight in our lives.

My prayer is that our participation in the paschal mystery leads us to ever stronger faith in Jesus, the Blessed Son of God.





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
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
