



Pastor's Corner Month of May - Month of Special Devotion to Mary

Beloved Parishioners,

When I was growing up as I child, I recall how the beginning of every month of May till the end of May was a great month for me as May Devotion. It is a month of special devotion to honoring Our Mother Mary especially with the recitation of the Rosary and other forms of Marian devotion. At that time, the entire parish assembles every evening in the church for evening Rosary before the Blessed Sacrament which is exposed as we recite the Rosary; at the end there was Benediction, and this happens throughout the month of May. It was so important to us that my parents would ensure that all our house chores and homework assignments were done early enough to give us the opportunity to be punctual for the rosary devotion in the church. To date I still recall how we chant various Marian hymns during this special month of May and on Sunday evening during this month we chant the full decade of the Rosary in procession round the church. On any day when it was my turn to serve the thurible and incense for the benediction or walk with the priests during Rosary procession, I felt as if a special favor had been granted me. There are still many cultures and nations that still observe the month of May in a very special way. Here in our parish, we do the crowning of Mary after each Mass on the first Sunday of the month of May. I am praying that we try to do more individually or as a family to give special honor to our Mother Mary this month.

There are different traditions on how the devotion to Mary in May started, but one tradition has it that the devotion started in Rome, towards the end of the eighteenth century, on one fine evening in May. A child of the poor gathered his companions around him and led them to a statue of Mary, before which a lamp was burning, as is the custom in that holy city. There, these fresh young voices sang the Litany of Our Lady. The next day, the little group, followed by other children, again gathered at the feet of the Mother of God. Next came their mothers, to join the little assembly. Soon, other groups were formed, and the devotion rapidly became popular. Holy souls, troubled by the disorderly conduct which always increases and becomes graver at the return of the pleasant springtime, saw in these growing practices the hand of God, and they cooperated with the designs of Providence by approving and promoting this new devotion, as a public and solemn act of reparation. The Month of Mary was founded. It is a month when special graces are poured upon us because of Mary's intercession.

Beloved parishioners, as we begin this month of May, I would call on each of us to utilize this month to devote more time in honoring our Blessed Mother Mary in our families by reciting the Rosary daily. This is also a period we can ask for special favors through her intercession for some special need and be assured that through her intervention in our crisis we would be helped. "As Catholics we believe that Mary can intercede on our behalf and bring our prayers to Jesus. This belief is based on the idea that Mary, as the mother of Jesus, has a special relationship with Him and can ask Him for favors. We as Catholics therefore pray to Mary and ask for her help in times of need, such as during illness or difficult times." One of the sayings I learnt as a child is that Mary's wishes are command to Jesus. Let us ask for her special assistance in all that we need and be hopeful and confident that our prayers will be answered, and our needs attended to.

Finally, I end with a quote from John Paul II my favorite Pope on Mary "The Blessed Mother is a Mother for all of us. She doesn't discriminate. She is not only our lifeline to Jesus, but she is always with us in our moments of joy and failings in life. We can always go to our Mother in heaven for comfort and help."

Theme: God is Love

6th Sunday of Easter Year B, May 5, 2024 First Reading Acts 10:25-26, 34-35, 44-48, Second Reading 1 John 4:7-10, Gospel John 15:9-17

Peter, in the first reading, proclaims that God shows no partiality "Rather in every nation whoever fears him and acts uprightly is acceptable to him." This is because God is love and shows His love to everyone no matter your circumstance or state of life. Thus, anyone who opens himself or herself to Him experiences the depth of His love. The only obstacle to witnessing God's love in our lives is when we close ourselves to His love. This can happen when we fail to believe in Him, obey Him or keep His commandments, but even at that He still loves each one of us in an amazing way. The theme of God's love also is seen in the second reading, "everyone who loves is begotten by God for God is love". Then, in the Gospel Jesus says, "As the Father has loved me, so I have loved you, and remain in my love; abide in my love. If you keep my commandments you will abide in my love. Just as I have kept my Father's commandment and abide in his love."

According to John's Gospel "God so loved the world that He gave His only son, so that everyone who believes in Him has eternal life." (Jn 3:16) That is to say, that God gave His Son to our world, gave Him to a crucifying death for our own sake that the world may be saved. God gave His Son that each one of us will find meaning in life through Him. In John's first epistle he reiterates what the Gospel said, "God's love was revealed among us in this way: God sent His only son into the world so that we might live through Him." If God has done this for us, what do we do to reciprocate this love He has shown us? It is a question everyone should answer for himself or herself.

St. Paul reflecting on the love of God in his writing to the Romans says. "Rarely will anyone die for a righteous person though perhaps for a good person someone might dare to die. But God proves His love for us in that while we still were sinners Christ died for us." This is a very profound statement to reflect on, that while we were still sinners God died for us. He gives us the insight of His love for humanity. (Rom 5:7-8) The fact is that God's only Son was born like any of us was born, died more cruelly than any of us may ever die, then we ask for what purpose, so that you and I might have life. A life that may never die.

On our part, to love one another is not a platitude but a prescription, not a counsel but a command. Jesus in this speech uses the word "LOVE" eight times in sixteen lines. Laying down of one's life will often mean a lot of little laying downs of our selfishness for the good of others. When we are selfish and refuse to love, we build a wall around ourselves and condemn ourselves to a winter of loneliness and bitterness. But when we love and care, the wall falls, and we experience a springtime of joy and peace. Let us allow the Holy Spirit which has been poured into us, to fan the flame of love into action.


