Pastor's Corner

Beloved Parishioners,

In my pastors' corner this week I wish to share with you some virtues of the life of Saint Louis of France 1214-1270 which we last celebrated two weeks ago on August 25. His feast day is celebrated every August 25 to coincide with the date of his death and birth into the glorious kingdom of heaven. According to his biography, Saint Louis became the King of France at the age of 22. He was married and had eleven children. Thus, despite his youthful age and with a large family and saddled with the responsibility of governance of his kingdom, he never lost the goal to make it to sainthood. This goes on to prove that heaven or sainthood is open to anyone no matter your state or position in life.

His biography states that he was known for his life of prayer, penance, and concern for the poor. Prayer here means a constant awareness of the presence of God and making God his priority. Penance was his second key to life, which involves self-examination and confessions. This requires being truthful to oneself in one's relationship to God and neighbor. It also means availing oneself of the sacrament of confession regularly. Heaven, our goal as Christians, should be pursued with true reconciliation which frees us of any inclination to sin which gives us a peaceful heart. The concern for the poor means giving assistance to those in need irrespective of their situation. It requires giving up something for the sake of others and making sacrifices to improve the life of other people. Beloved Parishioners, looking at the life of St Louis, let his model of prayer, penance and care for the poor become part of our own attitude as Christians.

Bishop John Dolan visits our parish next Saturday, September 17 2022. He will celebrate the 4pm Mass with us, after which he will be asked to bless our pavilion building, Saint Joseph's Hall, before he goes.

Theme: The Love and Compassionate Mercy of the Father

24 Sunday in Ordinary Time Year C September 11, 2022

First Reading Exodus, 32:7-11, 13-14, Second Reading 1 Tim 1:12-17, Gospel 15:1-32

Today's Gospel's passage is one of those passages in the Bible we have heard many times however, at each time we read it afresh, it resonates new insights about God's mercy and love. God's compassion is unlimited; He wants to embrace us always with this love. Nevertheless, one central message the passage presents is God's compassionate love which does not dwell in the past. It tells a story of love of the merciful father to his prodigal son who returns in humility to the father. The father is ready to embrace all those who are lost and return to him. In this way, our Father in heaven is constantly moved with great compassion each time we return to Him in humility of heart. We should never get tired of going back to the Father when we lose our way.

One other insight I get from today's passage is the statement of the evangelist Luke, "Coming to his senses he thought to himself I shall get up and go to my father and I shall say to him, I have sinned against heaven and against you." We need to ask the grace of God to be able to come to our senses to recognize our lost path and get back to our root. There is great need to recognize when we have lost our way in life. It is very certain that if we do not come to our senses, we would never make our way to the Father. The parable of the Prodigal Son shows us an image of our Father who is also prodigal- a spendthrift with His love for each of us, His unadorned and vulnerable children.






ROSARY SUNDAY OCTOBER 16, 2022



Where does the priest and servers get ready for Mass?

The Priest (and deacon) gets dressed and ready for Mass in a room called the Sacristy. This room contains all the garments for the priest to wear and the other supplies for the altar servers and the Mass. There is also a special sink in the sacristy, called the sacrarium, which leads not to a drain but directly to the earth. The water from washed Mass linens (purificators) and purified Mass vessels is poured down the sacrarium drain after each Mass.
