# Pastor's Corner

## ***Updates from the Bishop's Visit***

My Beloved Parishioners,

As we continue our journey as a family in this parish, I wish to share with you some updates from the Bishop's visit. The Bishop's visit started with one-to-one meetings with all the priests and deacons in the parish. As a new Bishop he wanted to know the members of clergy within his diocese. The meetings went very well, and he was very impressed with the work and evangelization taking place in the parish.

Next was a corporate board meeting of the parish. This meeting consists of the pastor who is the President, the chairman of the parish council, (who serves as the secretary), the chairman of the finance council (who is the treasurer), the Bishop who is the president, and some members of the Bishop's team who oversee the diocesan finances. The budget of the new fiscal year (July 2022 through June 2023) was approved in this meeting. Thereafter, there was lunch with the Bishop and his team. They were very impressed with the hospitality of the parish, our parishioners who catered the food and dessert, and the members of the funeral reception ministry who hosted the luncheon. It was fabulous.

There was then a large meeting which involved some members of the parish council, building committee, finance council, the school board, some members of the parish staff and school principal. It was mainly to discuss the school project amidst the challenges of inflation, high material costs, and supply chain delays presently facing the world. The principal's report showed a significant growth in the school enrollment in our parish school and the excitement of the students, parents and teachers of our school. Right now, the school has a population of over 100 kids and we are in the 6<sup>th</sup> grade. Religious education in the school program has attracted many people from public school to join in our catechism classes. Right now we have over 90 students in the program which has not happened in a while. It is a sign that the school serves as an instrument of growth in our parish for the future. Our major challenge is space for 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grades by next year. It was stated that this calls for urgency as time runs out.

Hence, it was resolved that two classrooms must be provided so that no child who intends to come to our school is turned away. Looking at the situation, even if we begin construction of the new school today, it cannot be ready by next year because of the challenges of supply chain and other issues I have previously stated. At the end, it was decided that the best thing would be to see how to create two spaces from the existing school building in the interim while the parish takes time to plan for the execution of the new school project. It was equally encouraged that there should be greater communication with the parishioners in all areas of parish activities.

The other important information needing to be shared with you, my parishioners, is the report on the Together Capital Campaign which many of you have pledged, some have finished, and others are still fulfilling their pledges. The expected amount that should come back to the parish from the diocese has been remitted back to the parish in the tune of \$438,000.00. In addition, the parish has received \$500,000.00 from the diocese in support of the school project. Thus, the parish has received the sum of \$938,000.00 from the diocese for the school as of June 30, 2022. If we can reach our goal, the rest of the capital campaign funds will come back to us. My prayer is that we do not get tired of continuing to fulfill all our pledges and to support the building of the new school which would have offices and a gym in it.

## Theme: Faith Key to Removing Obstacles and Difficulties

27<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time of the Year C. October 2, 2022

First Reading Habakkuk 1:2-3, 2:2-4, 2 Timothy 1:6-8, 13-14, Luke 17:5-10

The Liturgy of today presents us with the issue of faith. In the first reading from the Prophet Habakkuk, it says “the righteous shall live by faith” while in the Gospel the apostles asked the Lord to increase their faith. And in response Jesus told them “if you had faith as a grain of mustard seed you can say to this mulberry tree be rooted up, and be planted in the sea, and it would obey you.”

The question is what is faith? How can we grow in faith? Hebrew 11:1 says, “Faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen.” Hebrew, 11:11, “By Faith Sarah herself received power to conceive, even when she was passed the age, since she considered him faithful who had promised.” Vs 28 “By Faith the people crossed the Red Sea as if on dry land.” When God reveals Himself to us He gives assurance and conviction that His power and presence and glory is just as real, even more real than our experience of the natural physical world around us. **Things around us can change but God never changes. He is constantly ever true to His word, always faithful to His promises. God is ever faithful, reliable and dependable.**

Habakkuk had his prophesy around 610-600bc. It was during the reign of Josiah who was a grandson of Manasseh. Josiah had proved to be a good king unlike his grandfather who was evil. Josiah inaugurated a reform of the worship of the true God. He suppressed the activities of the worship of the lesser shrines throughout the land, where idolatrous practices were entrenched. The temple itself was purified and rededicated, and the people were encouraged to worship God joyfully with singleness of heart. There was peace and progress in the land and a true worship of God flourished in the land.

It was during these great reforms for true worship of God initiated by King Josiah that he was killed by the Babylonians a pagan nation ruled by a pagan king. They could not understand this reversal of events. Men and women began to probe their hearts to find answers to their searching questions. How could God allow such a terrible thing to happen? If the reformation ideals of good king Josiah had been correct, God should have allowed the king and the nation to prosper. Instead, the king had been killed and the nation had been subjected to new foreigner masters. Why should the wicked Babylonians whose evil were well known triumph the good and God-fearing King Josiah. It is as a result of this that the Prophet cries out, “How long, O Lord I cry for help but you do not listen. I cry out to you Violence.”

The answer comes to Habakkuk in a vision Habakkuk 2:2 “And the Lord answered, “write the vision, make it plain upon tablet, the just one because if his faith shall live”. Those who love God must exercise patience. Patience is one way in which our Faith in God is tested, therefore we need patience to experience this special favour of God especially in times of troubles and crisis. God’s ways are true, despite the terrible nature of the present circumstance. God is still in control of this world. We are called to have total faith in God despite the apparent challenges we face in life.



Yes, lay persons assist in the Mass in a special way in various roles. The primary way that lay people assist in Mass is as members of the congregation, joining their prayers to those of the priest. Lay persons may serve as lectors or readers who read the Scriptures other than the Gospel (first and second readings) and the general intercessions; as cantors who sing or chant the responsorial psalm which occurs between the first and second readings; as commentators who serve to introduce or explain the readings; as acolytes to serve at the altar and assist the priest or deacon and to assist in distributing Communion; as extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion who assist the priests in distributing the Eucharist; and as altar servers who serve the priest at Mass.



### ROSARY SUNDAY IS OCTOBER 16, 2022


