Pastor's Corner

Understanding the Mass

Beloved Parishioners,

In last week's message in this corner, I stated there will be a two-day retreat in the month of December to help us prepare for the season of Advent and Christmas. The retreat will take place on Monday, December 12th and Tuesday, December 13th and there will be evening and morning sessions to give everyone the opportunity to participate. The fruit of any good retreat depends on the disposition of the person doing the retreat while the work of the retreat moderator is simply to stimulate reflections that would guide a person in that journey. Thus, I would encourage as many of us as possible to dispose our hearts to benefit from this spiritual exercise.

Again, at the beginning of this year's advent season, we will be going through the Mass for a deeper appreciation and understanding of what happens during the sacrifice of the Mass. This will be a short video presentation and short side talk before each Mass. The Eucharist, as defined by the Fathers of the Second Vatican Council, is "the Source and Summit of our Christian life." The Mass is the climax of all our Christian liturgy, and it is very important that we who participate in it understand very well the great mystery that is embedded during the celebration of the Mass. "All other sacraments and every other ecclesiastical ministry and work of the apostolate are oriented towards the Eucharist." Every other sacrament we celebrate in the church is focused to help us participate actively and worthily in the Mass. This is because in the Eucharistic Sacrifice of the Mass Christ himself is our Pasch, the priest, the victim, and the altar of the sacrifice. As a result of lack of proper catechesis at times, many of us have not fully realized the rich value of the Mass and it is my wish in this way we would come to learn more of what this Sacrament is.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church No 1325 says, "The Eucharist is the efficacious sign and sublime cause of that communion in the divine life and that unity of the people of God by which the Church is kept in being. It is the culmination both of God's action sanctifying the world in Christ and that of worship men and women offer to Christ through him to the Father in the Holy Spirit." Then CCC No 1326, concludes by saying, "by the Eucharistic celebration we already unite with the heavenly liturgy and anticipate eternal life when God will be all in all."

Therefore, a good understanding of all these things that take place at the Mass will help us appreciate deeper what goes on each time we come to celebrate the Mass. The teaching of the Mass will go on for several weeks in all the Masses and I enjoin everyone to come early and be part of this moment. For those of us who already know very well the rich value in the Mass it will be a moment of renewal of what you already know while those who don't have such deep understanding it will deepen your value and knowledge of the Mass.

It will be presented in series on parts of the Mass each Sunday until the whole Mass is covered. The priest during the homily may, at times, throw more light on the part presented that Sunday. Please share this message with your friends and neighbors to come and learn more about the Mass beginning the First Sunday of Advent.

Theme: The Day of Lord Comes

Thirty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time of the Year C, November 13, 2022

First Reading Malachi 3:19-20a, 2 Thess 3:7-12, Gospel Luke 21:5-19

Today, we live in a world of so many uncertainties, wars, violence, disease, family disintegrations, religious violence, dangerous theologies and philosophies, economic and political turmoil. These events have pushed many to conclude that the end time is very near. Many people also have caved in on these events and gone ahead to prophesy that the end of the world is very close at hand. Some others have been pushed to lose their hope in God and man. As a result, the problem of irreligiosity increases in the world. Prophet Malachi in the first reading brings it home when he says, "Lo the day is coming, blazing like an oven" giving an impression of a terrible day, that all things will be burnt down. However, towards the end he gives very encouraging and consoling words, when he says, "For you who fear my name, there will arise the sun of justice with its healing rays." That is to say, that those who fear the name of the Lord and abide in His words, they should not be shaken by the uncertainties of wars and violence they experience or hear about.

These were the similar situations we encounter in today's gospel reading. Jesus had foretold many signs that would shake peoples and nations. He talks especially about the destruction of the temple of Jerusalem. Therefore, they began to ask for signs, but He warned them not to look for signs, but to pray for grace and mercy. He says that there will be terrible earthquakes, famine and other terrible things, but that does not mean that the end is near. What is important is that one remains steadfast in his faith. Jesus in today's gospel reading reminds us that a future judgment and outcome awaits every individual who lives on earth. This is not to frighten us nor are we to be afraid of the judgment day to come. Our responsibility is to strengthen our resolve, to trust in God and do His will, and to work towards peace and reconciliation, which begins with our immediate family members, friends and relations.

Many have focused more on the signs that would signal the end of the world but have failed to ponder on the simple declarative statement Jesus made when He said, "about that day and hour, no one knows, neither the angels of heaven nor the Son of Man, but only the Father". We should not give in to the various prophecies that have filled our world today.
