

Pastor's Corner: Thankful & Grateful

Beloved Parishioners.

This week I wish to defer my message so that you can hear a message from the heart of one of our beloved parishioners who has been so moved by the kindness and generosity of the parish community. Her message to the parish follows.

Dear Friends, some of whom we have not met yet,

We want to express our deepest gratitude for your prayers and very generous help in this difficult time of need. I am in awe of this beautiful, openhearted community and its support to us. I can honestly say I have never in my life felt this level of love and support pouring towards me from complete strangers. As you know, my daughters Oktavia 17 and Aurelia 13 were run over by an SUV on Swanson Ave. on Oct. 28th and immediately flown to Las Vegas for surgeries. They have undergone surgeries, have long metal screws in their bodies and are both home now. Oktavia came home 2 weeks ago and Aurelia who turned 14 at the hospital has been home for 2 days now. I am incredibly happy that they are home for Christmas. In my testimony I want to say that God is Very Real and Absolutely Incredible. My girls kept fighting me that they should not have to wear helmets on their moped because 1) Arizona law says they don't have to, 2) because Oktavia is such a good and careful driver, 3) because this is a small town, and nothing will ever happen. On the day of the accident, they had all the reasons NOT to wear helmets as I was in Utah dealing with a repair, so I was not here to pester them. Good Father, God's will was that they both wore their helmets and thanks to this they are both alive! Their sustained injuries could have been so much worse than they were. With SO MANY broken bones, their organs were not pierced. 2 RNs stopped immediately at the scene of accident to help my daughters. Many people gathered and did anything they could to help. God is Incredible!! Tears of thankfulness are pouring down

my face as I am writing this testimony. So many things happened right after the accident that seemed completely Divinely coordinated. When I received the phone call that my children were badly injured and were being flown to Vegas, I started screaming in pain like a wild animal in the middle of a Home Depot Store in Utah. All these women started gathering around me knowing that something really bad had happened, created a circle, put their hands on my back and just prayed even though I was in such a pure shock, I could not speak. Then they made sure I did not drive until I could function ok. When I got to the airport there was a flight to Las Vegas in 1 hour. The ticketing agent told me he did not have an open seat. Just then the police officer looking after my girls' case phoned, spoke with the agent and I was able to get a seat. When I sat in the only seat available, I was praying for my daughters' safety and wellbeing in my heart, my body was shaking, and tears were pouring down my face. The lady to the left of me asked if she could hold my hand. She took my hand and started praying. After a while I thanked her and told her what had happened. She then told me that she has been working at the Sunrise Hospital where my girls were airlifted for 20 years and that they are in very good hands. Seriously, what are the chances of this??! Then the only person I know in Vegas, my friend who works away and is never home, I called her, she was home and told me she will right away meet me at the airport and bring me to see my girls. She stayed with us at the hospital for most of the first night. Nobody can tell me that God is not real, or that He is not PURE LOVE. He sent so many Angels our way.

Thank you again for all your prayers and generosity. We hope you All have the Warmest Christmas and are surrounded by family and friends feeling the kind of Love we are feeling right now.

Christmas time is a wonderful time to reflect upon the mysteries of our faith, and on the merciful love of Jesus.




Each time another year has gone by, we become introspective of the joys and sorrows that have touched us, and pray for God's assurance in keeping us in His loving care.

Theme: We Are All Called to be Mother of Christ

4th Sunday of Advent Year B, December 24, 2023

1st Reading 2 Samuel 7:1-5, 8b-12, 14a, 16, 2nd Reading Romans 16:25-27, Gospel Luke 1:26-38

We are very close at Christmas as tonight we begin the celebration of the mystery of the incarnation of Christ among us. As we can see the attention shifts from John the Baptist to Mary the Mother of God. This story is only found in Luke's gospel. Hence, we reflect upon Mary's example of faith and obedience to God which permitted her to receive the angel's message that God's son would be born as a human person as one of us. She is to be mother of Christ.

Mother of Christ is a title we usually reserve for Mary. But Mary is mother of Christ in two senses. She is mother of Christ in the physical sense that she carried Jesus in her womb and gave birth to him. This is an unrepeatable event and an honor that no other human being could share with her. But she is also mother of Christ in a spiritual sense. In a spiritual sense the role of being mother of Christ is available to all Christians. We all, men, women, and children, can and should become mothers of Christ. No one is excluded from this call to be the mother of Christ.

What is this spiritual motherhood of Christ and how does it happen? For the answer we need to go right back to Jesus Himself. While He was still speaking to the crowds, His mother and His brothers were standing outside, wanting to speak to Him. Someone told Him, "Look, your mother and your brothers are standing outside, wanting to speak to you." But to the one who had told Him this, Jesus replied, "Who is my mother, and who are my brothers and sisters?" And pointing to His disciples, He said, "Here are my mother and my brothers and sisters! For whoever does the will of my Father in heaven is my brother and sister and mother." (Matthew 12:46-50)

This shows that first, Jesus expects His followers to be not only His brothers and sisters but His mother as well, and secondly, the way to be the mother of Jesus is

by doing the will of God. Spiritual motherhood of Christ is attained by saying yes to God, just as Mary did, even when God appears to demand from us what is humanly impossible, like asking Mary to be a virgin mother. To become mother of Christ we need to make the prayer of Mary our own: "Behold the handmaid of the Lord, let it be done to me according to your word." (Luke 1:38)

God bestowed on Mary all the greatest favors in order of grace. Whether the sun was shining, or the sky was black, Mary was led by His grace. Why was the extraordinary favor done to Mary alone? Because, as St. Paul tells the Romans, "When the mystery of Jesus Christ, hidden from many ages, was finally revealed, God expected human beings to believe and obey." (Rom 16:25-26) Mary was the first disciple of Christ to believe and obey. Her faith was humble and hence she first believed and only then reasoned upon it. Yes, God wanted Mary to submit even that noble reason to faith. Some people cling to their reason so adamantly that they are never able to see the light of faith. Mary's faith was ever active and hence she not only accepted the divine truth but dwelt upon it, used it and developed it. Her faith was ever active and hence "the handmaid of the Lord" did not exclude even death from her faith. Her obedience was risk taking when she said, "Let it be done according to thy word." (Lk 1:38) She did not realize the full implication of the word. Her obedience was loving. She loved God and hence trusted in Him and obeyed. Mary kept on saying "YES" to God till the end of her earthly story. Let's imitate Mary by saying "Yes" everyday by our own act of faith and obedience to God especially as we prepare to welcome Him in our lives this Christmas season. Merry Christmas to you all, as I wish you and your families a graceful celebration of Christmas and a prosperous New Year.


