

Pastor's Corner

Blessing of the New Year 2024

Beloved Parishioners.

I begin my Pastor's Corner of this New Year with the prayer of blessing taken from the book of Numbers we read on New Year's Day in which the Lord instructs Moses to bless the people in these words. "The Lord bless you and keep you. The Lord let his face shine upon you, and be gracious to you. The Lord look upon you kindly and give you peace." These are my prayers for each of you and your families that the Lord blesses you, protects and keeps you under His wing. May His healing mercy and His grace abide with you throughout this year. My prayer is that His face shines on you that you may continue reflect His life in every aspect of your encounter this year. Hopefully, with His kindness upon you, you would be drawn closer to Him and radiate His love to others especially those who seek true love in their lives.

The beginning of every year also calls for thanksgiving to God for giving us another opportunity to enjoy His love and friendship. It is a time to take stock of the year that has gone by and see the blessings we received over the past year when things have not been so well. We examine where we may have fallen short in our relationship with God and make a sincere resolve to do better. We look at our encounters with others, beginning with our close family members, and pray for a better way forward. It is noteworthy at this time of year, that we make a firm decision on how to connect with those whom we have issues with and ask for the grace and courage to begin to build a healthier relationship.

At the beginning of every new year also comes with renewed hope on what God holds for us for the coming year. No matter how things may have been for us in the year gone by, we have stronger hope that the beginning of a new year will usher in better things ahead. Hence, hope is one thing that is very needed at the beginning of each year. Thus, I call on everyone to renew our hope in God and never allow any disappointment of the past year to discourage us from moving forward knowing that God is ever present in every situation, and He is ever faithful.

Resolutions also form some part of our agenda for a new year. "Some of the most common New Year's resolutions are losing weight, getting more physical activity, eating more nutritious foods, cutting back on alcohol, reducing stress and sleeping better. No matter which healthy resolution you choose, research suggests that some common strategies can boost your chance of making the change a habit, a part of your daily lifestyle. One challenge with New Year's resolutions is that people often set unrealistic goals. They can quickly become frustrated and give up. Any resolution to change needs to include small goals that are definable and accompanied by a solid plan on how you'll get to that goal."

Let us begin with very practical and sincere resolutions that can be part of our daily lives and from there move to a higher level. I would also encourage that you set one goal at a time instead of making too many resolutions and not following them up. Take one at a time and see how far you will go with it. Secondly, avoid giving up too easily in your resolve but with strong determination move on and God will give you the grace to succeed. In your new year resolutions always begin with prayer and end with prayer for prayer changes things and transforms situations.

Finally, our virtue for this month is patriotism. Patriotism is simply defined as a feeling of love and devotion for one's country. The feeling of patriotism is based on the positive values the country advocates and embraces. Some of these values are things like justice, peace, freedom, and equality. Though it must be pointed out that at times when this feeling is pushed to an extreme it can be harmful. But the good thing is that a sense of patriotism helps us respect and obey the laws guiding the country. Another sense of patriotism is that it makes for good citizenship. One cannot have a good feeling of the country without being a responsible citizen of the country.

I wish you all a fruitful new year ahead praying God to grant all our prayers, resolutions, and your heart's goals for the new year.

Theme: Jesus is the Star that Guides all Our Lives

Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord Year B, January 7, 2024 1st Reading Isaiah 60:1-6, 2nd Reading Ephesians 3:2-3, 5-6, Gospel Matthew 2:1-12

Jesus the incarnate word being revealed to all the nations of the world. The Church calls it, the feast of appearance or manifestation of the Lord. Epiphany comes from the Greek word and means "Manifestation". The Church celebrates the light of God's revelation of his Son as human in Jesus Christ. The story of the magi is the story of the ways in which God reveals Himself to us and even more about the different responses and reaction this revelation receives. The Lord of the universe who reveals the star of Bethlehem to the Gentiles of the East gives each one of us the same light of revelation to recognize and accept Jesus as Our Lord and Savior.

Jesus constantly reveals Himself to us in different ways and our reactions vary as the people during the time of Jesus. In today's feast of the Epiphany, there are three major reactions to the revelation of Jesus. The first person is Herod and the likes of him. His reaction to the news of the revelation of a king born in Bethlehem was the reaction of hatred and hostility. Herod was afraid that this infant king was going to interfere with his life, his place, his power, his influence and therefore the instinct was to destroy him. He should not live because His presence will be a disturbance to Herod's peace and life. In the same way, when you hear the word of God or receive his message which probes your conscience or challenges your life, what is your reaction to it? Do you kill that message inside you or do you let it die gradually. Do you welcome it with joy and make an effort to change? What tabernacle is the same Jesus the wise men found in is your reaction?

The other group is the reaction of the chief priests and scribes during the time of Jesus. They were also told about the birth of Jesus. Their reaction was that of complete indifference to the news of the birth of a king and a savior. It did not make any slightest difference to them. They were so engrossed in their temple rituals and their legal discussions. They were more interested in their own affairs that Jesus' birth

Today, being the feast of Epiphany, we celebrate means nothing to them. What is your reaction as you go through this write up? Are you interested or disinterested in the message of Jesus? Are you concerned with your own affairs that you don't bother about Christ's message or His Church? Are you among those so engrossed in their own affairs that you don't have time to come to Mass on Sunday or come occasionally? Are you among those who come to Mass with eyes on the watch just to leave the Church even before the Mass is over because you are so busy with other private concerns?

> Then we come to the last group, the reaction of the wise men from the East. The reaction of adoring worship, the desire to leave everything and seek Him out where He is and worship Him and the desire to lay at the feet of Jesus the noblest gifts which they could bring. These wise men are those who read the signs and stars in nature and according to their astonishing accurate knowledge something great has occurred in the Jewish nation, the birth of a very special king. Thus, we learn from today's feast that God speaks to us humans not only through the scriptures, the word of His revelation, He speaks also through the book of nature. However, the wise men from the East did not worship the stars; they worshipped the one to whom the star pointed to. The events of nature most often point to us about the magnificent nature of God, and it is this God we should worship and not the nature that reveals the mighty deeds of God.

Finally, the Eucharist and Jesus present in the Mary's arms. We should examine ourselves to see how we adore Him when we encounter Him at Mass or when He is exposed to us. Do we realize that it is the same Jesus in the tabernacle that we encounter when we come into the Church? Do we worship Him profoundly and give Him due honor when we enter the Church, or do we pay less attention to His presence each time we come into the Church? May this light of God's revelation fill your family with peace. Happy New Year!






