

Pastor's Corner

The Value of Fasting

Beloved Parishioners,

Fasting is one of the core aspects of Lent and the goal of fasting is to discipline our minds, body and spirit and draw close to God in a more profound way. All the major religions of the world especially, Christianity, Islam and Judaism have fasting as one of their religious duties. The familiar days of fasting from the Apostolic times are Wednesday and Fridays. The Friday fasting is mostly observed in many Christian cultures to recall the day of the Crucifixion. The scripture, both Old and New Testament, is filled with references with fasting. In the Book of Joel 12:2 we read "Even now declared the Lord, return to me with all your heart, with fasting, weeping, and mourning." In the New Testament, Jesus himself gave us an example of fasting in scriptures. "Then Jesus was led by the Spirit into the wilderness to be tempted by the devil. And he fasted forty days and forty nights and afterwards he was hungry." This happened at the beginning of His public ministry; it shows us how Jesus went into fasting and prayer before He began His public ministry. It tells us the need of fasting and prayer whenever we are to embark on any project of importance.

Fasting also helps us draw close to God in a deep spiritual journey. When fasting we deny ourselves food, drink or some pleasure and focus more on God. The essence of fasting is not to reduce weight but to rid us of unnecessary attachments, which become obstacles to giving ourselves completely to God.

Lent gives us a very graceful opportunity to fast as we journey with the Lord in these forty days of sacred period which includes fasting, prayer, and almsgiving. Fasting from food and drink are not the only things that we can fast from. We can fast from too much time on TV/Movie to maintain the discipline of the eyes. We can also fast from social media and

secular music to control our distraction. We can also fast from bad words and hurtful words against others to look inwards and see if we are not doing the same thing against those we judge and criticize. We can also fast from slander, jealousy and pride which destroy our relationship with God and one another. These other aspects of fasting are necessary as they are part of the self-restraint and discipline of Lent. However, there are those who cannot fast from food because of health challenges or age; but fasting from sin is encouraged for everyone.

Furthermore, fasting and prayers go together because whenever we are fasting, we are in the spirit of prayers and God's Holy Spirit becomes more present in our lives. There are numerous spiritual benefits one gets from embarking on fasting. It helps to hear deeper God's voice in our lives as the period of fasting restrains us from falling into occasions of sin. Embarking on fasting for spiritual growth can help to discover some hidden sins that we may not have confessed. Fasting also helps us build a closer relationship with God. We become sober internally which allows us to seek God's face in a more profound way that brings us closer to God. Fasting can teach us to pray with the right motives. At times, our motives can be disordered as we come before God in prayer but during the fasting period the motives are most often better directed. In fasting we recognize our need for God who comes to fill our heart and desires. Finally fasting helps us build a strong prayer patten.

Beloved parishioners, as part of our Lenten observances I encourage everyone to decide on the nature of fasting to embark on this period. Remember, as I said earlier, that whatever you give up as part of your fasting should be used for the good of others, especially the needy and the poor.

Theme: A Loving and Obedient Relationship with God Brings Peace

3rd Sunday of Lent Year B, March 3, 2024

1st Reading Exodus 20:1-17, 2nd Reading 1 Corinthians 1:22-25, Gospel John 2:13-35

In today's first reading we are called to a complete obedience and respect for God's commandment if we are to maintain a good relationship with God and with one another. God's commandment is designed for our good and when we obey it for what it is, it gives meaning to our lives as the only way we can demonstrate our love for God is to keep His commandments. Thus, Jesus tells us in John's Gospel "If you love me keep my commandment." Jn 14:15

Today's Gospel describes the encounter between Jesus and the temple officials within the courtyard of the temple as the Passover of the Jews draws near. The area may be what we call today the Narthex, the space between the main Church and outside of the church building. The Passover is the greatest of all the Jewish feasts. Everyone flocks to Jerusalem to celebrate this great feast because of its significance in the lives of the Jews. Thus, part of the celebration would require certain sacrifices that would be made in the temple. Those who come for the feast would need to buy the required animal for participation in the temple worship. Many need to change their foreign currency to local currency to be able to purchase the animal needed for the sacrifice. This created an occasion of exploitation of these pilgrims and neglecting the essence of the main sacrifice. The law says that every adult male Jew who lives within fifteen miles of Jerusalem was bound to attend it. It was not only the Jews in Palestine who came to the Passover but Jews all over the world as it was the dream of every Jew, no matter the land he stays to celebrate at least one Passover in Jerusalem.

This desire to celebrate the Passover in Jerusalem coupled with all the required taxes every male of a certain age is meant to pay turned the temple court a

place of exploitation instead of a place of worship. Moreover, this exploitation is happening in the house of God against those who have come to worship God with a pure heart and mind. These acts of wickedness in the hearts of temple religious officials were what moved Jesus to kick them out of the temple.

Jesus comes to purify the temple to restore it as a place designated primarily for true worship and sacrifice to God. By His action He identifies Himself as the new and living temple in which the divine presence dwells. As members of Christ's body, we need to constantly purify ourselves of anything that obstructs us from listening to the word of God and obeying His commandment. As can be seen, these actions brought a lack of reverence to temple that is meant to be a Holy and Sacred place. Worship without reverence can be terrible as it becomes a worship which does not recognize the holiness of God. That made Prophet Isaiah to say, "This people draw near with their mouth and honour me with their lips, while their hearts are far from me." Isaiah 29:13.

This is an invitation to examine ourselves and how we revere the places of worship in our individual lives, especially when we enter the church. It equally calls for an evaluation on the Church authority if fundraising for some projects has taken over the true worship of God in our Churches and celebration. The example of Jesus in today's Gospel calls for a rethink of how we revere places of worship, by our actions and dressing in the Church. As we journey in this Lent let us equally draw closer to God by a life of repentance, purification, and prayer by listening to God's word.

Hand Carved in Bethlehem

Please stop by the Tables of Religious Wares (Nativity set, rosaries, statues, crucifixes, charms, etc.) after all the Masses the weekend of March 2 & 3, 2024. Ayman Khair is representing about 180 Christian families from Bethlehem. These families have been dependent upon sales of their hand carved religious articles to tourists of the Holy Land. Due to the conflict in the Middle East and the Pandemic, tourism has been stopped completely from March 2, 2020, till February 2022, and now because of what is going on in the Holy Land tourism has stopped completely. It is very important to support them at this critical time, since they have no income and there is no tourism at all. In order to survive, they have turned to Christian communities in the United States to purchase their articles. These hand carved religious articles are beyond description. Carved from wood of the sacred Olive tree, this workmanship has been traditional for these families for hundreds of years. It is hoped that through the efforts of Mr. Khair, these families who have little income are able to stay alive and survive in the Holy Land. Sadly enough, the Christian population dropped from 22% to less than 2% in the last 20 years. Thank you in advance for your support.




