

Pastor's Corner

A Call to Positive Change & Newness

Beloved Parishioners,

I continue my reflection with you in this Pastor's Corner and today, after my summer vacation, I want to share a reflection on what can bring a positive change in our spiritual life. We read how Saul changed to Paul following his Damascus experience of Christ (Acts 9:1-9) and how Christ himself renamed Simon, the head of the apostles, Cephas or Peter (John 1:42), but I really wonder if we have ever thought of the significance of the great change that comes with an encounter with Jesus Christ. As I have always said, no one encounters Christ and remains the same. One thing is certain any encounter with Jesus brings a positive change. Paul, the great evangelizer, reassures us of this when he stated that "if any man be in Christ, he is a new creature: old things are passed away; behold, all things are become new." (2 Cor. 5:17)

We commit this continuing change and renewal when we frequent the Eucharist. Every time this mystery is celebrated, "the work of our redemption is carried on" and we "break the one bread that provides the medicine of immortality, the antidote for death, and the food that makes us live forever in Jesus Christ." (CCC, 1405). This presupposes that we remain faithful to the sacrament of penance or conversion which is the hub of our spiritual and physical renewal. It is called the sacrament of conversion because it makes sacramentally present Jesus' call to conversion, the first step in returning to the Father from whom one has strayed by sin.

Daily renewal happens by the grace of God, yet it requires something of us, too. God has His part; we have ours. The kind of renewal that makes the greatest impact in our lives happens every day; it is defined by our diligence, our decision each day to take time for the nurturing of our spiritual life. Our part translates to a focus on the simple acts that make

up our faith lives already: reflection, prayer, action. Renewal happens when we take time each day to reflect and open ourselves to humility. A humble heart is a heart renewed. The Word of God brings us renewal when we engage it to help us know and do God's will for our lives. Knowing comes from staying close to God in prayer; doing comes from staying God-centered in daily life. When we work to emulate Jesus, there is renewal.

This change and renewal that we talk about is not only on a personal level. On the ecclesial level, we see that the Church renews herself too. In fact, the Church cannot exist without renewal just as we have seen with the Vatican II renewal. Therefore, we ourselves must channel our individual renewal to reflect in the community. We encounter Christ, get transformed and thus get commissioned to become agents of change poised to transform others by the examples of our life. We must learn to show concern about the community in which we live and associate as a catalyst of change. Hebrews 10:24-25 exhorts us "to be concerned about one another in order to promote love and good works, not staying away from our meetings, as some habitually do, but encouraging each other."

The Holy Spirit, who is the agent of renewal, bids us to emulate the lives of the saints who have lived before us and fashion our lives in the way that is pleasing to God. We must strive every day to die to sin and not make the worldly standards our rule. As Saint Paul tells us "Do not be conformed to this age, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, so that you may discern what is the good, pleasing, and perfect will of God." (Romans 12:1-2)

May our Blessed Mother and all the Saints continue to intercede for us to remain committed in our resolve to attain this newness. Amen. Do have a blessed week ahead.

Theme: Miracles Happen When We Believe in the Prophet Sent to Us

14th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year B, July 7, 2024 First Reading Ezekiel 2:2-5, Second Reading 2 Corinthians 12:7-10, Gospel Mark 6:1-6

According to the Living Liturgy 2021, "Each reading this Sunday is about those who were singed by failure and vulnerability, but who continue to be a guiding light to their communities. Ezekiel is sent by God to the people named as rebels, who are obstinate, defiant, and deaf to God's word. Paul in the second reading finds himself facing opposition both from those who regard themselves as super apostles and who tout around the word of God for their own reputation, and from the members of the Corinthian church who have fallen under their influence. And Jesus in the Gospel is found to be unacceptable in his own hometown of Nazareth."

The Lord sent Ezekiel to go and deliver His message to His people whether accepted or not but let that word be spoken to them. The Lord knows they are obstinate of heart but still He wants His words to be spoken to them by His prophet Ezekiel. This is a responsibility to every guardian, teacher and parent who has been entrusted with people to look after. The truth must be spoken whether accepted or not by those you look after.

Then in the Gospel Jesus came into His native village, entered the synagogue, and began to teach them and the people were astonished. They said, "Where did this man get all these? What kind of wisdom has been given him? What mighty deeds are wrought by his hands? Is he not the carpenter, the son of Mary and the brother of James and Joses and Judas and Simon? And are not his sisters here with us? And they took offense at him." They took offense at Him because they felt they knew Him too well and thus He should not possess such wisdom. Where did He get this wisdom? Because they feel they know Him they paid less attention to His message. As a result, He could not perform many miracles in their lives. Most often we disregard

important messages that could benefit our lives simply because we are too familiar with the person or messenger. At times we fail to listen to important messages that can transform our lives because we focus our attention on the status of the person giving the message and not the content of the message.

From these two readings the first lesson we get is that God continues to speak to our hearts, and He wants us to be open to the messages He sends us through His prophets. Let us not close our hearts to God's message or neglect the messengers He sends us. As parents He wants you to continue to speak to your children the truth, the values and principles that will guide them in their lives whether they accept it or not, whether they pay attention to it or not. Do not give up telling them the truth that will help them in their lives. Young people, my appeal is that you pay good attention to what your parents tell you. Do not look down on them or disrespect them for any reason. Finally, parents never stop talking to your children if they do not listen now. One day in the future they will remember and recognize that your words and advice were meant for their good.

The other important message is that miracles happen when we believe and trust the messenger of God sent to us. If you cannot trust the messenger of God, how can the message of God that they proclaim bring you divine transformation that could change your situation? But if you believe in him, as the messenger of God, then his prayers can attract the miracle of God in your lives not withstanding his status. God can use anybody to accomplish His design for you. We are called to pay attention to what the messengers of God tell us.

Office Coordinator-Fulltime Position 40 hours/week with benefits

The Office Coordinator is directly responsible for all aspects of the Parish front desk operations and assures the effectiveness of day-to-day office operations. The successful candidate will demonstrate excellent oral/written communication and interpersonal skills. Must be able to work independently, with minimal supervision and frequent interruptions. Requires excellent organizational skills, the ability to multi-task and the ability to work well with staff and volunteers in a team environment. Must be skilled in Microsoft Office computer applications (Word, Excel, Publisher, PowerPoint) and Google apps (Gmail, calendar docs).

Communications/IT Coordinator-Part time Position under 30 hours/week; no benefits

This position provides communication and technology support for the Parish operations, utilizing established print and digital media including social media, video and streaming technologies. Will be required to troubleshoot hardware errors and manage network equipment. Responsible for making the announcements both for the live streams and those projected at mass, monitoring and updating Our Lady's Facebook and YouTube pages. Coordinate the live streaming of the 10:30 am mass on Sundays and any other events that require live streaming. This may require evening and weekend work. Act as web administrator to manage the Parish's website to optimize its performance and increase its online visibility. The successful candidate will demonstrate excellent oral/written communication and interpersonal skills. Will be tasked with multiple duties or projects at once, making organization a critical skill for success. Must be able to work independently, with minimal supervision, and be able to meet deadlines and schedules. The ability to collaborate with staff is needed. Essential that applicant be proficient with all social media platforms. Must be skilled in Microsoft Office computer applications (Word, Excel, Publisher, PowerPoint), Adobe Photoshop, and Google apps (Gmail, calendar docs).

Maintenance Worker-Part time Position 20-25 hour/week; no benefits

The position will consist of a variety of maintenance tasks to ensure the buildings, grounds, and equipment are safe, operational, and secure. Expected hours are 4:00 pm to 8:00/9:00 pm Monday through Friday and Saturday as needed. Duties will include keeping the church, classrooms, and halls clean and ready to use.
