Pastor's Corner

Updates and Appeal for More Active Participation in the Life of the Parish

Beloved Parishioners,

For the past several weeks our reflections were focused on themes drawn from the Second Vatican Council documents and some Pope's encyclicals. However, as we begin this month of August, I want to share some updates from the parish and school.

Our school opened its door for the new academic year last week and it is my joy to share with you that our school enrollment has witnessed some significant increase from last year. At the close of last year's academic year our school enrollment was at 129 students but at the beginning of this academic year our school enrollment has increased to 142 and many more families are still making inquiries of getting their children admitted to our school. In addition, we have added another grade, and we now have Pre-K to 8th grade in our school. To God be the glory for His many blessings to see us through to this stage. It is through your prayers and support in various ways that we make such great progress. Our hope is to continue to work hard to make positive impacts in their lives and raise them up to be good and responsible citizens who imbibe our Catholic values.

In that respect, I express my profound appreciation to the principal, the teachers and the entire staff of both the parish and school. The parents and our PTO are not left behind in these words of appreciation as your support has been indescribable. The amazing job you do bears great fruit in the community. I also extend my appreciation to the various councils and many individuals who have been supportive and generous to the school's progress: the School Advisory Committee, the Parish Council, Knights of Columbus, Catholic Daughters, the Finance and Building Committee who are putting heads together to start off our new school building that will equally have our offices, we say thank you to you all.

Furthermore, I send my gratitude to all who have worked hard and are still working to get the Daytona rectory ready for Fr. Johnson. Many of you have sacrificed your time, resources and energy to give the

rectory a facelift. The sacrifices of these people have saved the parish from the huge amount the parish would have spent on it. In a special way, many thanks to the following: Yvonne, Tereé, Erin, Dan, Jay, Rosa, John, Richard, Gregory, Pedro, Brad and Juan for working extra time to get it ready early enough. The collaboration among many of our parishioners to achieve such a success in a record time is a testimony of the spirit of love and generous heart that exists in our parish. We remain very grateful to you as we pray God Almighty to bless you and visit you at your point of need.

Beloved parishioners, it is my joy to announce to you who are not yet aware of a new lunch kitchen in our parish. We now have Mary's Kitchen in our parish, and they prepare lunch every Sunday after 12:30pm Mass for those who are interested. It is also an avenue for socialization and getting to know one another. These women came together on their own to prepare lunch every Sunday after 12:30pm Mass for anyone who wants to eat out. They start serving food at 1:30pm at St. Joesph Hall and their food is very delicious and affordable. You can order your food ahead of time and pick it up after the Mass. The proceeds go to support the church and it has been amazing how much they have contributed to the parish income since they started. Those of us who have tasted their food can give testimony to the fact that their food is second to none. Personally, that's where I have my lunch every Sunday afternoon now. I am inviting those who have not yet visited them to come and experience it for yourself.

Finally, I continue my appeal for many of you to consider getting more and more involved in the parish activities. I have made the appeal in the past and some responded but we are still appealing for many more volunteers. We need people in various ministries; it depends on what you feel the spirit is calling you for service. As your pastor, I am appealing for many to consider being part of Christ in the Neighborhood Ministry which has become a blessing to our parish. Theme: Do not Work for Food that Perishes

18th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year B, August 4, 2024

First Reading Exodus 16:2-4, 12-15, Second Reading Ephesians 4:17, 20-24 Gospel John 6:24-35

Today's gospel reading is a continuation of last Sunday's reading where Jesus multiplied five barley loaves and two fish to feed the people and at the end, they were all satisfied with about twelve baskets as leftover. This miracle is more than just feeding the people to satisfy their physical hunger, it goes to point to Jesus as the bread of life and as one who sustains life. Having fed very well, the crowd was so amazed at the miracle that they started looking for Jesus. On seeing Jesus, they told him, "Rabbi, when did you get here"? Jesus immediately told them "you were looking for me not because you saw signs but because you ate the loaves and were filled." He then told them "Do not work for food that perishes but for the food that endures for eternal life." The question for our personal reflection is, what is this food that endures for eternal life and how do we work for it?

By stating do not work for the food that perishes, Jesus invites us to work for that which endures beyond material satisfaction. That food which must endure for eternal life must be that which is beyond physical or material satisfaction. It is that which has a lasting effect in our lives. Jesus is that food that endures for eternal life and no other thing can give us total fulfillment except that who is complete in itself, and that person is Jesus. It is a call to seek Him who is the author of life who in His presence is peace and serenity. Jesus has said, "I am the bread of life, whoever comes to me will never hunger and whoever believes in me would never thirst." This is a statement of faith and when one believes in these words of Jesus and applies it to oneself, one sees the amazing satisfaction Jesus gives.

There is a connection between the first reading and the gospel in this instance. The people of the Israelites were on the way when they complain and grumble for lack of food. God rained down food from heaven that the Israelites may eat to continue their journey to the promise land. The rain of manna in the desert is a pre-figure of the multiplication of bread for the people. However, it is more than that because in the Eucharist it is no longer bread falling from heaven but Jesus who gives us Himself to eat. This is what He did in the last supper when He took the bread and broke it and gave to the people and said, "take this and eat it this is My body which is given up for you." It is on this that Jesus makes this statement that when we eat His body we would live forever, because He lives in us to sustain us and nourish us. The experience of the people in the desert teaches them to rely on God who provides for them. In the same way we are to rely on Jesus who is the bread of life that sustains us and gives us life.

The final message Jesus gives us today is to strive for that which endures for eternal life and does not pass away or perish with time but on things beyond material. Most often our attention is centered only on material things which pass away but we should recenter our focus on things that really matter which is Jesus and life eternal which only Jesus can give.

May God give you His grace to work for things that endure and bless you and your families with peace.
