Pastor's Corner

Eucharist Adoration: An Invitation to the Veneration of Christ's Divine Presence

Beloved Parishioners,

The gospel reading for the past two weeks, and the following weeks is centered on John Chapter 6 where Jesus says I am the Bread of Life and the Eucharist. In follow up to this theme I wish to share reflection on Eucharistic Adoration which I have been encouraging all to make it as part of special devotion.

The Eucharist is the source and summit of the Christian life (CCC 1322). As Catholics, we profess the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist which is the affirmation that Jesus Christ is truly presentbody, blood, soul, and divinity-in the Eucharist. This doctrine has been foundational and operational in the Church since Christ instituted the Eucharist at the Last Supper (Matthew 26:26-28, Mark 14:22-24, Luke 22:19-20, 1 Corinthians 11:23-25) but was definitively defined during the Council of Trent (1545 -1563). Different Popes have explained this basic teaching in their writings. For instance, in Mysterium Fidei (1965), Pope Paul VI focuses on the mystery of the Eucharist, affirming the Church's belief in the real presence of Christ in the sacrament; further, in the encyclical Ecclesia de Eucharistia (2003), Pope John Paul II emphasizes the centrality of the Eucharist in the Church's life and its role in fostering unity among Catholics.

Given this esteemed place of the Eucharist in Catholic spirituality, one important and significant practice in our Catholic tradition is Eucharistic Adoration. Eucharist Adoration is a devotion which centers on the adoration of the Eucharist, the true Body of Christ. This adoration offers a unique way for us to encounter the divine, as well as provide a spiritual refuge and an opportunity for us to deepen our relationship with God. At its core, Eucharistic Adoration is an extension of the celebration of the Mass. During the Mass, the bread and wine are consecrated and become the Body and Blood of Christ. In Adoration, this consecrated Host is placed in a monstrance allowing the faithful to focus their devotion on this tangible representation of Christ. The practice is not merely a ritual; it represents a personal invitation to encounter Christ in His most intimate and accessible form.

The origin of Eucharistic Adoration can be traced back to the early Church, though it became more formalized in the Middle Ages. Saints like Thomas Aquinas and Julian of Norwich have written extensively about the mystery of the Eucharist and the importance of reverent worship. By the 13th century, the practice of reserving the consecrated Host in a special tabernacle for the purpose of Adoration became more widespread. This period also saw the development of the monstrance, which enabled a more visible and accessible form of worship.

The practice of Eucharistic Adoration provides us with several spiritual benefits. First, it offers us a space for quiet contemplation and prayer, away from the distractions of daily life. This silence is often seen as a form of divine dialogue, where we can present our concerns, seek guidance, and experience a profound sense of peace. Again, it also encourages a form of worship that is both communal and individual. While many of us participate in Adoration in groups, the experience is deeply personal and can lead to significant spiritual insights and growth. Additionally, Eucharistic Adoration fosters a sense of reverence and devotion in us because it reminds us of the sacrificial nature of Christ's love and the importance of living a life of holiness. This devotion also encourages acts of charity, prayer, and personal transformation, reflecting the central message of the Gospel such that many who engage in Adoration report a heightened sense of gratitude and a renewed commitment to their faith.

Theme: Jesus is Truly the Bread of Life that Strengthens Us

19th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year B, August 11, 2024 First Reading 1 Kings 19:4-8, Second Reading Ephesians 4:30-5:2, Gospel John 6:41-51

Elijah, in the first reading of today, presents a very despairing situation because of the challenges he faces in his ministry to the point that he prayed for death. However, instead of granting his request God sends him heavenly nourishment through the angels to keep him going. There are at times when we are confronted with life challenges like Elijah, we become so depressed that we may have prayed that God take our life. The good news is that the angels are never far from us when we face such life challenges. The angel of God comes as well to provide us the strength we need to embark on the journey of life but recognizing the angel depends on how open we are to see them in moments of trials and difficult situations. Paul, in the second reading, calls our attention to certain things we must get rid of in our life to enrich our relationship with God and one another. According to Paul, "All bitterness, fury, anger, shouting and reviling must be removed ... forgiving one another as God has forgiven us." The truth is that resentment, bitterness, and anger not only create a big barrier in our relationship with God but can harm our physical health and even at times affect our internal organs. Anytime we allow bitterness, an unforgiving spirit and anger to take hold of us we chain ourselves and refuse to unlock the chain to set ourselves free.

The Gospel presents us with the encounter between Jesus and the Jews. They had been fed

the previous day and they return hoping to be fed again but Jesus challenges them not to work for the food that perishes but for the food that endures for eternal life. They immediately demanded to be given such food so that they would not need to come back again and again. At that time Jesus tells them "I am the Bread of life that came down from heaven." This became a surprising shock to them, and they could not understand how Jesus could make such a statement. That is why they murmured and asked themselves, "Is this not Jesus, the son of Joseph. Do we not know his father and mother? Then how can he say, "I am bread that have come down from heaven."

The Jewish doubt at the time of Jesus has not changed with some of the doubt of our time. The problem of the Jews then was over familiarity with Jesus, and they could not understand how this man they know very well would say that He came down from heaven. In the same way, a lot of people including Catholics still question if Jesus is truly present in the Eucharist. This situation has equally led to the poor reception of the sacrament. The truth remains that Jesus is truly present in the Eucharist, and we can only see it with the eyes of faith.


